### -NEWS AT THE HAVEN-

Easter and April go hand in hand with the arrival of spring, making it a great time to teach young children about the changing seasons. Here are some simple spring-themed lessons:

- Planting Seeds: Introduce children to the concept of growth by letting them plant seeds in small pots. Over time, they can observe how the seeds sprout and grow, giving them a hands-on lesson in the life cycle of plants.
- Spring Weather: Discuss the changing weather of spring and how it affects plants, animals, and people. You can do simple science experiments like making a rain cloud in a jar to illustrate how rain is formed.
- Animal and Insect Exploration: Spring is a time when animals like baby chicks and bunnies are often associated with Easter. Teach children about baby animals, and consider using toy figurines or a trip to a local farm to show them the real thing. You can also talk about insects like bees and butterflies that emerge in spring.
